Gospel Outreach






How wonderful is our Lord! The blessings he has bestowed upon us and those we reach through our mite offerings is truly awesome. Dear women, you all deserve a huge thank you for the mites you collected in the last biennium. Our mite goal was met and slightly exceeded our goal a month prior to our Convention in Morristown. God is Good, and His servants are faithful! Our convention offerings, Basket Bonanza, and Prayer walk for missions has started us on our new mite goal of \$23,000.00. 25% of our mites will be going to our national mite goal; 5% will stay with the NJ District for administration costs; and 70% or \$16,00.00 will be used for our Mite Grants set at our convention:

- 1. YWR programming NJ \$3,000
- 2. Lutheran Friends of the Deaf \$3,000
- 3. LCMS Mission Central \$3,000
- 4. Our Savior Preschool, Stanhope \$2,000
- 5. LCMS Ministry to the Armed Forces \$3,000
- 6. Bethania Kids Foundation \$2,000

The Basket Bonanza and Prayer Walk raised \$1,030.00 for mites. 70% (\$721.00) will go for our grants in NJ, 25% (\$257.50) will go to National mite grants and 5% (\$51.50) will go to administration. We add \$717.00 from our second offering at convention to the \$721.00 from the Basket Bonanza and Prayer walk for a total of \$1,438.00 towards our mite goal in NJ. We're almost halfway there to completing our first grant. Keep it up ladies and gentlemen! Send in your pictures of mite gathering events. Share what you are doing to help edify the kingdom. You are awesome servants of our Lord Jesus!





Gifts of the Heart and Servant Events from Convention







Talk about being blessed. We thought our in-service events would produce 100 "socks of Love" for the homeless, 10 fleece blankets for the Morristown Children's Hospital, and a few layettes for Today's Choice Pregnancy Center. Our gifts were doubled to these agencies. 165 "Socks of Love" were made. 18 Blankets made and given to the hospital. Trunk, back seat, and passenger seat were filled with items for Today's Choice. These recipients were overwhelmed by our items and generosity. (See Thank you notes on p.7) I personally loved the laughter and good conversation that occurred as we worked on these "Gifts of Love." I can't say it enough ladies and Pastors, you are truly a blessing!

As we get ready for our Fall Retreat and Fall Rallies we have set the Military as our in-service gathering. Chaplains are looking for items to give out to make a personal connection with the men and women. Cards, Candy, Treats, Beef Jerky, Trail Mix, Packaged cookies and crackers, Personal products such as sunscreen, lip balm, foot powder, Throat Lozenges, Toothpaste, Shampoo, Body wash, and deodorant. They also want to see who sent the items. Include pictures of you or your group. Send drawings for the troops from your preschool children or Sunday school. 

An Important Lesson Learned at School

School is back in session all over the country, including our church preschool where many children are attending for the first time. One little girl had been crying nonstop, refusing to nap, and her weary teacher had tried everything. Being in the hallway, I knelt down and opened my arms. The little child toddled over, put her arms around my neck, lay her head on my shoulder and, exhausted, fell asleep. As I held her in my arms and rocked her for the next hour, I thought how similar our relationship with our Lord is when compared to the little child.

For many little pre-schoolers, there is an important lesson that they must learn, and young children who go to Sunday School for the first time also must learn this same lesson: "It's ok. Mommy will be back. She will pick you up, like she promised she would. You don't have to worry. You don't have to cry." Interestingly enough, some moms (and dads) also need to learn a similar lesson. "It's ok. Your child will be here when you come to pick them up. You don't have to worry. You don't have to cry!" (When your child goes off to college, the military, or off to other places on their own, you have to learn this lesson all over again.)

I don't mean to minimize the emotions related to dropping off a child at pre-school (or at college, or their first home). The feelings (both the children's and the parents') are real, and the feelings are deep. However, I believe these feelings also help us understand the feelings Jesus' disciples felt when Jesus was getting ready to go to the cross as well as when He ascended into heaven. Jesus told His disciples before He went to the cross "18 will not leave you as orphans; I will come to you. 19 Yet a little while and the world will see me no more, but you will see me. Because I live, you also will live." John 14:18–19 (ESV). Then, following Jesus' ascension, the angels encouraged the disciples with these words, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking into heaven? This Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven." Acts 1:11 (ESV).

There is a special love that connects a child with his or her parents. Even when the child is at school, he or she stills feel that connection, which is confirmed when the parent comes to pick up the child. That same connection exists between us and our Lord Jesus Christ. Even more so, that connection exists in His heart toward us. And just as the parent returns to pick up the child to go home, so too our Lord is coming back for us to bring us to our heavenly home. Until that time, we wait with the same confident hope that the preschooler learns as school progresses — "Mommy's coming back. You don't have to cry. Mommy loves you." Yes, Jesus is coming back. We don't have to cry. Jesus loves you. Amen.

1. YWR Programming and outreach for the LWML NJ District	\$3000
2. Lutheran Friends of the Deaf – Bible stories in sign language	\$3000
3. LCMS Mission Central to directly support missionaries	\$3000
4. OSLC Nursery School, Stanhope- outreach to unchurched families	\$2000
5. LCMS Ministry to the Armed Forces – Chaplains & wives	\$3000
6. Bethania Kids – share gospel with orphans in India	\$2000

- Lily, the comfort dog, and her handler, Linda Cinquegranna, from Lutheran Church Charities shared their ministry to people in need of comfort and care during our Saturday luncheon.
- Marilyn Schroeder, our National LWML Representative, updated us on new LWML initiatives and resources.
- Donna Pyle, noted CPH author, provided an inspirational message on being "Connected to the Vine" during our Bible Study time together. She also signed her books at the CPH exhibit.
- President Tony Steinbronn brought greetings from the LCMS-NJ District and Rev. Dr. John Nunes and his wife, Monique, were our keynote speakers for our Saturday evening banquet together.
- Our YWR, Kristin Dolby, and our H2H Sister, Roshay Wilson, enjoyed a Saturday morning Special Focus Breakfast, participated in a pinning ceremony, and performed a skit for us which highlighted the upcoming 2019 National LWML Convention in Mobile, AL.
- Morristown Memorial's Children's Hospital benefited from our servant event in which we tied 18 fleece blankets and delivered them to the hospital. We also made 165 "Socks of Love" which were given to Food Banks in Dover, NJ and Bridgeton, NJ to distribute to the homeless and those in need.
- We had a Mission Walk inside the hotel due to inclement weather, but still raised \$435 for mites. Our Basket Bonanza raised \$595.00 and we thank our societies for their creative baskets!
- We had 12 exhibitors in our exhibit hall that shared their mission work and resources with attendees.

Seeking LWML National Convention Banner Design Submissions


To all you crafty women out there...
