



How was your summer? Were you able to do all you planned? Did you have time for rest and relaxation? As summer fades we can be sure that our LWML mission focus and action has kept going. It is wonderful to share that we have achieved two more Mission grant goals with our mites. We have \$3,000 in funds available for the **Anchor of Hope Grant** and \$1,000 for **Gethsemane Preschool Playground Equipment**. Both grants will be presented in September. Praise God that we can provide funds for His work to be accomplished through our mites. Our next goal is \$1,500 for Mission Grant #7 which will provide **Spanish Braille Bibles to Central and South America** through the efforts of **Lutheran Braille Workers**. We are reminded that out of every dollar, 75 cents remain in our New Jersey District. Let us continue to be faithful with our mite donations.

At LWML National Convention in June the National Mission Grant goal was set at \$2,350,000 for the 31 grants that were voted on for the 2023-25 biennium! That is just 25% of all the mites collected around the United States. Isn't that amazing!!!Please check out the LWML website to see which grants were approved. Each month one or two mission grant projects are highlighted. So... look and see, what the Lord is accomplishing through your mites!

NOW is the time ladies to look to our own LWML New Jersey District Mission Grants for the future. That is the 2024-26 biennium! The future is right around the corner. The **Mission Grant Guidelines** are on the lwmlnj.org website. How do you begin? Well... Check out the mission grant bank on the lwml.org website for some inspiration. Look around at the ministries that are happening in NJ; In the LCMS NJ District; or in your community. Then consider these criteria to evaluate the project.

1. The grant is mission-focused and will share the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The Mission emphasis is:

- -Extending the ministry of the Word
- Reaching the unreached for Christ
- -Extending the ministry of Word and Sacrament
- -Strictly Mission in Character
- Bringing the saving Gospel of Jesus Christ to people who have never heard the Good News
- -Spreading the Gospel
- How does this project share the Gospel with those who haven't before heard it or believed it?
- 2. The ministry reflects the vision and mission priorities of the LCMS as found on LCMS.org
- **3.** The ministry will be able to implement the project when funds are disbursed within the biennium in which they were voted upon or the biennium following.
- 4. The ministry is ongoing in nature, with assurance of continuing after the grant monies have been expended.
- 5. The ministry has provided a financial statement or budget as part of the mission grant proposal.

I look forward to seeing the new mission Grant Proposals. If you have any questions, please contact me. The deadline for submitting proposals is November 15, 2023. So... let's start praying and see what opportunities are around us for mission projects in our LWML New Jersey District!!!!

"Never Abandoned"

I was up early this morning. No real reason. But when I woke up at 3:00am, I could not fall back asleep. After tossing and turning for a bit, I decided to head down to the couch and watch TV. One of the shows I occasionally get sucked into is called "*Mysteries of the Abandoned*" on the Discovery Channel. Have you seen it? This shows travels the world in search of ignored and neglected ruins. They rediscover all sorts of long-forgotten engineering marvels, decaying cities and empty factories that once stood on the cutting edge of design and construction. Today, these relics are a shell of what they once were. They are rotting and falling apart. In each episode, historians and engineers examine the heyday of these old engineering triumphs. They tell the stories of who originally designed the structure, its historical significance, and why it was ultimately no longer viable. Sure, it is great to see the pictures and the videos of when those places were full of life. Yet despite the bustling days of the past, such abandoned structures are now an unavoidable depiction of that site's current uselessness and demise. Even though these structures were once the talk-of-the-town, they have come to a sad expiration. The stories of their "glory days" are all in the past. These sites are essentially dead. There is no present. There is no future.

Thinking about this show, I thought of statistics I've heard over the years regarding the church. About 3,000 churches close per year in our country. These church buildings are then sold, bulldozed, or now sit abandoned. Additionally, it was reported about 1.2 million people leave the church each year. Each one abandoning their congregation and giving way to faith decay.

We have a God who has promises, "Never will I leave you. Never will I forsake you." The presence of our God and the love He has for us exists beyond any set time or tangible place. He is reliable and dependable. Psalm 94:14 says, "The Lord will not abandon his people; he will not desert those who belong to him." What an incredible promise God makes to us! And this promise is not solely to us as individuals, but also to His church. God will never abandon your congregation. He will never abandon the LWML.

Knowing that God is with us, and desires to bless our ministry and mission, assures us that the LWML is still on the cusp of our heydays. Our "glory days" are ever ahead! Because the Lord is present with us, our future is unambiguously bright. So dear sisters in Christ, continue to gather and worship. Continue to study and serve. Continue to reach out and continue to invite others in. The mission of the LWML is unchanging—to *joyfully proclaim Christ, support missions, and equip women to honor God by serving others*. Based on the numbers above, you faithful ladies are needed now more than ever! So keep at it, and know the Lord is with you. We are never abandoned!

National LWML Convention Highlights June 22-25, 2023

















Highlights from the LWML Convention in MKE:

- Total number of convention attendees was 3,480.
- There were 75 Young Woman Representatives in attendance!
- Thirty-one new mission grants were selected for this biennium with a mission goal of \$2,350,000! Go to <u>www.lwml.org/mission-grants</u> for further details on each mission grant.
- Tee-Up-4-Mites, our convention golf outing, raised \$35,000 for mites!
- The Mission in Motion/Mission Pledge Walk raised \$100,000+
- The blood drive had 79 units of blood donated!



- Servant Events: 1,200 participants provided the following items to non-profit agencies in the region: 443 cards of encouragement, 4,751 witness bracelets, 50,000+ meal kits, 566 school backpacks, 457 cards of hope; 1,167 braille books, and 162 Fleece Blankets.
- Convention Offering #1 for Mission Grants was \$54,922; Offering #2 for "Called to Care" for foster children was \$31,037; Offering #3 was for \$18,360 for scholarships at Wolf Run Lutheran High School in Shawano, WI. and Offering #4 for the MKE area Crisis Pregnancy Centers and Concordia Gospel Outreach received \$2872.
- There were 83 Mission Flags representing the countries where LWML has provided mission grants.
- "Celebrate the Lord of the Nations" was a wonderful theme as we celebrated and enjoyed the fellowship with thousands of sisters in Christ!

What an awesome experience! It was a joy to be able to attend the National LWML Convention in Milwaukee in the fellowship with over 3500 fellow Christians. Highlights of the convention for me included:

- Participating in the voting process as a delegate
- Hearing the result of the mite grant vote—31 grants to be funded through a \$2,350,000 mite goal!
- carrying our district banner in the Friday banner procession
- participating in the Mission Flag procession on Saturday morning
- listening to the Mites in Action speakers and hearing firsthand how lives have been changed by God through the grants
- being spiritually fed by Bible study leader, Kaye Wolff
- being informed and encouraged by keynote speaker, Greg Seltz
- laughing along with humorous interrupters, Jan and Abby
- being entertained by the *Lutheran Ladies Lounge* podcast hosts Sarah, Bri, Erin and Rachel (I'm a huge fan of the LLL!)
- Walking in a sea of blue shirts along the Milwaukee River during the Mission Walk
- participating in worship services and singing (lots of singing!)

Every moment of the convention was uplifting and joyful. However, for me, the greatest highlight of the week was taking part in the Heart to Heart District leaders' training. There, I met 27 women from all over the US, who were from many different countries and cultural backgrounds, and enjoyed the fellowship and camaraderie of my new Sisters in Christ. We spent the two days prior to the convention, as well as some early mornings and late evenings learning more about the Heart to Heart Sisters of All Nations Program and being trained to lead and facilitate the H2H program in our districts. At the close of the training, during a pinning ceremony, I received my Heart to Heart Sister pin from President, Arlene Price. This group now meets monthly to encourage and support each other. In Milwaukee we began by sharing our own faith stories, how we came to faith, were mentored and nurtured in our journey, and the value of building relationships. We discussed culture and cultural diversity, and the importance of understanding, respecting, and celebrating each other's cultures. We also spent time brainstorming and dreaming what we would like the H2H program in our own districts to look like and what was essential. The overwhelming consensus was that establishing relationships was most important – finding and building connections between the multicultural women in our district, and between all women. The Heart to Heart program was established "so multicultural women may mutually encourage one another, support each other, and work together, living out the beautiful diversity that is the body of Christ." But it is not an exclusive group—we all are called to support and encourage our Sisters in Christ.

I am now one of three women in our district, along with Christy Ndem and Roshay Wilson, who have been trained to lead and facilitate the Heart to Heart program in our district, and we would like to partner with you to engage and empower our sisters in Christ from all cultures and backgrounds to serve their church, participate in the LWML, witness to others and grow in their relationship with Christ. We are always looking for new people to be a part of this program of the LWML. It was my pleasure to attend the archivist seminar offered at the 2023 national LWML convention. Presenter, Caroline Honeycutt - LWML archivist-historian, works with the Concordia Historical Institute (CHI) in St. Louis. When LWML records are sent to the institute, Caroline catalogs them for easy future reference. At district, zone and local levels it is important to keep orderly records to both preserve our history and avoid conflicts over misappropriation of resources.

What to keep & what to discard? The first thing to consider is that space is limited. Therefore, not all items are worth archiving. Secretary minutes, board & committee reports are essential. Pictures with names and dates are nice. If there was a writeup in a local paper of your event, save the page. Rally favors and handouts – not needed. Especially important are: IRS notices, bylaws, acknowledgement of gifts & grant that were received or paid. Records should be in archival boxes and labeled. How you choose to organize items is up to you. As per Caroline, most important is keeping all records that track how and why money is coming in and out of your account.

Where to store? Not everyone has a temperature controlled, water & fire proof basement like CHI. Again, Caroline says just make the best of available space. Archive boxes, etc. are available through Michaels Crafts and Gaylord Archival help preserve paper reports. Staples carries page protectors and pens. Don't be tempted to store digitally – think of the last time you used a floppy disc! Wherever you decide to store the records, make sure they are clearly marked and the current board is aware of their location. In the past, records have been discarded due to closet cleaners not thinking some old papers necessary. If you have any questions, please give me a call.
