

#### "Let Your Light Shine"

For God, who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ. - 2 Corinthians 4:6

As I sit writing this, the snow is softly falling outside. The clouds are keeping the sun shrouded and it is dark and cold just past my door. Within the house, I have been blessed with a fireplace and a goodly store of wood. After a couple of hours it's pretty well burned down to coals, throwing off lots of heat but little light. But I know that since the coals are "live", if I throw some new wood on it (especially pine or scrap lumber leftover from projects) it will come roaring back and fill the room with radiant heat and light.

During the season of Advent, for our midweek services, my congregation used the service of Evening Prayer. If you are not familiar with this daily office (found on page 243 of LSB), it begins with a service of light. Many of John's and Paul's passages about light begin our service. Then we have the *phos hilaron*, perhaps the oldest chant in our hymnal. The name means "laughing light" and speaks to the joy that is ours in Christ. That is then followed by the Thanksgiving for Light, an appropriate antiphon as the world becomes shrouded in darkness.

During the Christmas season we read again of the glory of God appearing to the shepherds as the angels sing, and perhaps also the star of Bethlehem pointing the way for the magi from the East. Now as we enter Epiphany (and the days are allegedly getting longer), we focus on light once more. This season is a season of revealing - of seeing what the Light shows and how Paul's passage above was fulfilled in Christ Jesus. Even in the cold and dark of winter we marvel at and rejoice in God's gift of light, especially how through the Holy Spirit, working through the means of grace, He shines His light into our hearts and illuminates our minds with His truth.

So what does any of this have to do with LWML? Well, have you seen how faces "light up" when a grant check is presented so that ministries may continue and expand? Have you seen a person "glow" when they realize they are not alone in their struggles and there are others who care about them? Our mites help to "brighten" the days of those struggling with many of the issues of this dark world. Our words of forgiveness, life, and peace "illuminate" minds who once thought God was their enemy instead of their greatest ally in the struggles they are enduring. Through the work of LWML in our District, our nation, and even around the world, we are chasing the darkness back to the shadows and letting the light of God's love shine forth through the Good News of Jesus Christ, who said, "You are the light of the world...let your light shine before others that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven." (Mt. 5:14, 16). In our New Jersey LWML, the light shines brightly.

Well, it's time to feed the fireplace - again. As we journey through Epiphany and hail Jesus as the Light that the darkness cannot overcome, may your lights be burning brightly as you gather for worship and study, fellowship and service, and as you present your mites so that the light of Christ may illumine many around us.



Provide updates on mission grant payments and fulfillment throughout the biennium and provide correspondence to grant recipients as appropriate. **Secretary:** Member of the LWML NJD Executive Committee who keeps a record of the proceedings of the NJ District Convention and all board meetings and executive committee meetings. Provide minutes to the members of the EC and Board of Directors prior to their meetings, and keep a file of all policy motions and standing rules.

**Treasurer**: Member of the LWML NJD Executive Committee who keep an accurate record of all receipts and disbursements; receives all monies and deposits them in a bank(s) approved by the EC; make all payments authorized by the EC; make payments on all approved mission grants as authorized by EC; submit regular reports to the EC and Board, and submit a report to the LWML NJD Convention

**Nominating Committee:** (one person from each Zone) Present a slate of nominees for each elective office for the coming biennium and gather their biographical information for presentation at the LWML District Convention.
